Title 1 services are meant to supplement but not replace regular classroom activities or assignments. A student receives extra help, given individually or in a small group.

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What is Title 1?

Title 1 is the largest federal aid program for elementary, middle and high schools. Through Title 1, money is given to school districts around the country based on the number of low-income families in each district. Each district uses its Title 1 money for extra educational services for children most in need of help. The focus of the Title 1 program is on helping all students meet the same high standards expected of all children.

Who is eligible to participate in the Title 1 program?

All students in Mary K. McQuerry are eligible to receive Title 1 services. Selection of students for Title 1 support is determined by:

- Consistent below grade level performance
- Classroom and i-Ready assessment scores
- Past participation

Parent Involvement/ Shared Responsibilities

Parent's right to know

- Qualifications of teachers and paraprofessionals who instruct their child
- Level of achievement of their child on each of the states academic assessments
- Child's assignment for four or more consecutive weeks to a teacher who is not highly qualified as defined by the law
